Santa Barbara, CA, September 28, 2023 – EARL MINNIS PRESENTS and Lobero LIVE present **An Evening with The Wallflowers on Tuesday, October 17, 2023 at 7:30 PM**. The Wallflowers have held their ground as one of rock's most dynamic and purposeful bands – continually honing a sound that meshes timeless songwriting and storytelling with a hard-hitting and decidedly modern musical attack. *Exit Wounds*, the group's latest studio offering released in 2021 via New West Records, finds the GRAMMY® Award-winning band's signature sound – lean, potent and eminently entrancing – intact, even as Jakob Dylan surrounds himself with a fresh cast of musicians.

1992 saw the release of their eponymous debut album, followed in 1996 by their best-known and highest-selling album, *Bringing Down The Horse*, which featured the GRAMMY® Award-winning track "One Headlight." The group went on to release an additional two critically acclaimed albums before going on hiatus. 2012 was the year the band reunited and released their sixth album, *Glad All Over*. Nearly a decade later, The Wallflowers released their seventh album *Exit Wounds*, which hit number three on the Billboard's Top Album Sales chart – making it the highest charting album for the band yet. Despite frequent personnel changes throughout the band's history, Jakob proved to be a strong bandleader who was capable of keeping the group's personality consistent.

Dylan's vision has always been the core of the Wallflower's music. How he chooses to express that vision, however, is what makes a song a Wallflowers song. To Dylan, a band, even one with a constantly shifting lineup, is a sacred thing. "I've always been a believer in collaboration," he says, "and no matter who I'm playing with I've always tried to include them very heavily." True to its title, *Exit Wounds* is an ode to people, individual and collective, that have, to put it mildly, been through some stuff. Jakob Dylan says, "I think everybody — no matter what side of the aisle you're on — wherever we're going to next, we're all taking a lot of exit wounds with us. Nobody is the same as they were four years ago. That, to me, is what *Exit Wounds* signifies."
